Guided tour

DURATION: approx. 1,5 h
GROUP SIZE: 1–50 pax.
PRICE: 40 €/group + entrance fee

CONTENT: Painter Reidar Särestöniemi (1925–1981) lived and worked the majority of his life in a remote location by the Ounasjoki river. His life and art are closely connected with the environment and the colourful nature of Lapland. The wilderness, bare fells, vast marshlands, the green forests and animals were his most important sources for inspiration. His paintings capture the colours and the changing seasons. The wooden architecture of the buildings is imposing. The childhood home is a farm from the late 19th century and the buildings represent a traditional style from the North of Finland. Gallery and Studio are magnificent log houses designed in the 1970's. One can enjoy our famous home made sweet buns in the Café, paired with a small museum shop. Särestö is for those who want to visit a unique museum that combines art and nature.

DIFFICULTY LEVEL: There is a bit of distance between the buildings, water proof footwear is recommended. The museum is not wheelchair accessible.

MEALS: Särestö home made lunch can be booked minimum 4 days in advance. Kindly contact us for more info.

GETTING THERE: The museum is situated in Kaukonen: village 30 min drive from Kittilä center, 1 h from Levi and 1h 10 min from Ylläs.
